

Moving Forward

For all things to be successful, they must evolve. Humans, animals, plants—indeed, the very planet—all of us together must adapt to change or create change, to move forward. So it is with organizations.

Tamarack has evolved over the years, steadfast in its mission to help injured wildlife and educate the community, yet malleable in its efforts to do so. As money and time ebbs and flows, so has the service. Yet it is always there.

Sue DeArment has been the backbone of this service nearly since Tamarack's inception. So shall she remain. Still, now is a time for change, an evolution of relationship. As other dedicated staff grow in their experience and capability, Sue is now able to turn more of the day-to-day operations over to the people she has nurtured, and will now take on a more advisory role.



Tamarack has reached a point where it can stand on its own with a solid base of volunteers. Over 100 volunteers donate their time and hard work to take dispatch calls, admissions, and feed and care for the education birds. Last year volunteer hours totaled over 9,000. An incredible effort.

Tamarack also has two new sponsoring veterinarians. Dr. Felix, our long-time sponsor, is retiring; he will now pass the torch on to

Drs. Ramey and Polumbo. These veterinarians will provide x-rays, examinations and advice for the more complex cases Tamarack encounters.

The final goal is to have two additional certified rehabilitators on staff. This role, historically belonging solely to Sue, will eventually be shared with Carol Holmgren and Kris Steiner, both veteran Tamarack staff. Having three rehabbers



will better enable Tamarack to care for wildlife and more evenly distribute the responsibilities of such a noble cause.

A cause which Sue DeArment carried in a very singular fashion for a long time. Now, she doesn't have to. She has been Tamarack's backbone, its hands, and its voice. Now, she can be its wings.

The Value of Birds Going to School

Research has proven that experiential learning is a very effective way for children to learn. That why. when staff volunteers take the education birds into schools programs, students and

get to have a personal and up close experience with the birds, engagement happens and learning takes place. The students immediately connect with the birds, feeling awe, empathy, wonder and excitement. They are engaged and listening intently—taking it all in. There is just no comparison to having the live birds present during a lesson and say--looking at pictures in a book or even watching a video.

Today's kids are constantly bombarded with images, data, and entertainment—sometimes to the point of sensory overload. The information technology available at a moments notice through TV, computers and phone aps can be overwhelming. With all of these distractions, children often do not spend a lot of time outdoors anymore. Therefore, having the live birds present and learning to talk softly and move slowly so as to not startle or frighten the birds is one way of helping slow the pace down and allows the kids to connect with nature on a personal level.

Teachers as well are faced with many demands on their time. With Science PSSA testing now done in grades four, seven, ten and twelve, getting all of the concepts and content addressed that the students need to know is a daunting task. Not only are students to be adept in Environment and Ecology standards but also Science and Technology. Tamarack's live bird programs have been correlated to both sets of standards and help address many of those concepts for different age levels and grades, thus helping teachers cover information in a way that the children will remember.



Fortunately, Tamarack's live bird programs are very affordable, even for schools that are dealing with major budget woes. Since the birds are able to travel to the school site, the expense of buses for students is eliminated. And if there is no money in the budget to sponsor the program, many schools or teachers fund the modest cost of a Tamarack program through contributions from their PTO, or by inviting donations of a dollar per student. Sometimes a little creativity is all that is needed to find funding.

Pennsylvania law requires that every wildlife rehabilitator have a sponsoring veterinarian. For the past 15 years, until his retirement in December, Dr. Ken Felix has admirably served this role. As sponsoring veterinarians, Drs Ramey and Polumbo will examine our more complex medical cases, perfom xrays and prescribe medications. They are graciously donating their time and services, charging only for medicine and supplies. We are grateful for their support and partnership.

Dr. Ramey received his Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) from Ohio State University in 1997. Already Dr. Ramey has examined a Bald Eagle and several other wild patients for Tamarack. His experience in avian and exotic medicine are assets as he examines our patients.

Dr. Polumbo also received her DVM from Ohio State University. She has an interest in exotics and assists in care of the Erie Zoo animal collection in addition to the dogs, cats and exotics she sees at Glenwood Pet Hospital. As a colleague of Dr. Felix, she has had the opportunity to examine some of our patients when Dr. Felix was unavailable.

Please note that **no member of the public should take wildlife to either Pet Hospital**. All wildlife must be admitted and examined at the Center. If needed, Tamarack staff will make an appointment for the wildlife patient to be seen.
